FEES & CHARGES

The policy of the department is that those who participate should help defray the overall costs of the activity. Fees and charges are therefore assessed according to the needs of the programs such as extra leadership, skilled instructors, and special equipment. Scholarships are available for the financially challenged.

NON-RESIDENT FEE POLICY (NRF)

Participants who do not reside within the County of Person may participate in our programs, however, they must pay a fee of 50% greater than resident fee or \$20.00 youth (age 18 and under) or \$30.00 (adult) non resident fee; whichever is less.

TOBACCO/ALCOHOL USE POLICY

The use of all tobacco products at all indoor premises operated by the Person County Recreation, Arts and Parks Dept. is prohibited. The use of alcohol on all county-owned property is prohibited.
